# Growth Mindset

On Friday we started the first of 7 BeeBOPS sessions that will be delivered every second Friday afternoon. BeeBOPS is our school's peer support program and this year it is based around Growth Mindset. Our Stage3 students are very capably going to be leading the sessions. If you have a growth mindset, you believe that with **work**, **practice**, **and perseverance**, you can improve – whether it's your academic performance, or any other skill.

Students in our first session learned about the different parts of the brain and how amazing it is that we can S-T-R-E-T-C-H it .






















# 2 T Spotlight


We request that you purchase a pack of envelopes, especially for school.
